iEducate’s in-class program has been adapted to address the wide range of school-specific learning needs brought about by the COVID-19 pandemic, with the goals of:


1. Increasing connectivity with students and their parents/guardians
2. Increasing student engagement and involvement in remote learning
3. Improving delivery of hybrid and remote instruction and resulting student learning growth

Remote learning services

iEducate offers a variety of services around both synchronous or asynchronous instruction. College Readiness Mentors are engaged to provide the following support services for both English and non-English speaking students during the remote learning period, and when schools transition back to in-class instruction.

iEdu's Remote Learning Support Pilot was implemented in Spring 2020 as an adaptation of our traditional in-class model due to the school closures resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic. After assessing the key challenges at each partner school, we delivered flexible instructional support to 20 classrooms (245 students) as part of a 7-week pilot.

Following school closures due to COVID-19, we worked with our district partners on needs assessments to better understand their biggest challenges during the pandemic. By prioritizing key challenges, and applying iEdu resources, we can leverage hybrid and remote instruction for more successful learning outcomes

Goals	Outcomes
Teachers - Increased effectiveness in delivery of instruction	➤ 100% of teachers indicated that their College Readiness Mentor helped better deliver remote instruction, and want them to continue supporting.
Students - Increased accessibility to and engagement in virtual class	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 100% of teachers indicated that their College Readiness Mentor increased student attendance as well as engagement in (synchronous) virtual lessons. ➤ 100% of teachers indicated that their College Readiness Mentor increased the number of students submitting assignments. ➤ 100% of parents/guardians indicated that interaction with the College Readiness Mentor made their child more interested in participating in the virtual class.
Students - Increased academic progress	➤ 100% of teachers indicated that their College Readiness Mentor enhanced students' learning growth as a result of the targeted individual or small-group support.
College Readiness Mentors - Increased teacher preparedness	➤ 100% of College Readiness Mentor agreed that this experience better prepared them to teach students remotely next year.
